Exhibits are open during our regular research hours: Tuesday through Saturday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

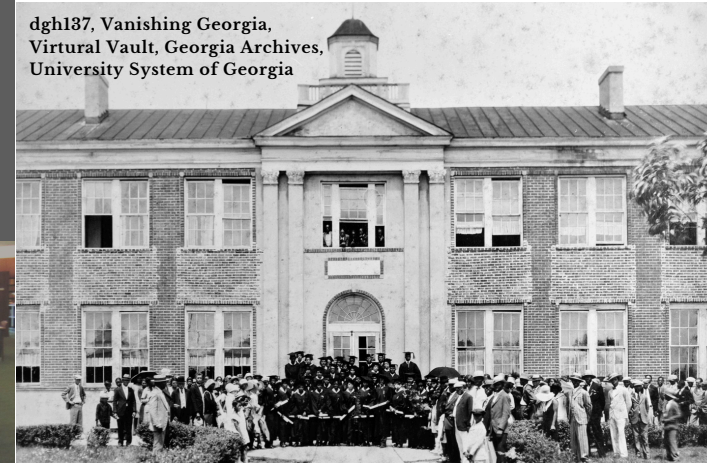
