When disaster strikes, it can be overwhelming to determine which records are most important to salvage. On Day One, participants will learn how to identify essential records, assess potential hazards, and mitigate risks before a disaster strikes. Day Two will focus on developing a Records Emergency Action Plan (REAP), disaster recovery procedures, and damage assessment. Featured guest speakers include Todd Watson, Chief Information Security Officer for the University System of Georgia, who will address cybersecurity, and a representative from a government agency who will discuss her agency's recovery from a mold outbreak.

Day 3: November 15, 2024

- Time: 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM

Day Three will offer hands-on training in disaster response, with a focus on wet salvage techniques for water-damaged records, mold identification and treatment, and surface cleaning demonstrations. Attendees will also practice using the Incident Command System for efficient disaster response.
