New Georgia Archives Exhibit: "Foundations of Higher Learning: Georgia's Early Colleges and Their Legacy"

The Georgia Archives is pleased to announce its new exhibit, *Foundations of Higher Learning: Georgia's Early Colleges and Their Legacy*, opening Saturday, January 4, 2025. This display highlights the origins, growth, and lasting influence of Georgia's first institutions of higher education.

Using photographs and historical documents, the exhibit tells the stories of colleges and universities that helped shape Georgia's academic history and provides insights into the role they played in shaping Georgia's communities and culture.

Visitors will see materials such as photographs, maps, and records from some of the state's most notable institutions, including the Medical College of Georgia, Wesleyan College, University of Georgia, Emory University, Clark Atlanta University, Georgia Tech, Savannah State University, Albany State University, Berry College, and Fort Valley State University.

The exhibit opens Saturday, January 4, 2025, and is open during regular hours at the Georgia Archives, 5800 Jonesboro Road, Morrow, GA. Admission is free and open to all.
