This fascinating tale of strategy, resistance, and resilience highlights the complex dynamics that shaped Georgia's role in the fight for independence.

A native Georgian, Dr. Greg Brooking holds a BA from Mercer University, an MA from Georgia College & State University, and a PhD in history from Georgia State University. With over 30 years of teaching experience at both high school and college levels, Dr. Brooking has dedicated his career to inspiring students with his passion for history.

His first book, *From Empire to Revolution: Sir James Wright and the Price of Loyalty in Georgia*, was published by the University of Georgia Press in the summer of 2024. He is currently working on an in-depth biography of Henry Laurens, a prominent figure in South Carolina's Revolutionary War history.

Dr. Brooking enjoys life with his wife, their blended family of five wonderful children, and one adorable granddaughter.
